

GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

The material submitted to *Intellectual Discourse* should not have been published elsewhere, and should not be under consideration by another publication.

Four types of contributions are considered for publication in this journal: major articles reporting findings of original research; review articles synthesizing important deliberations related to disciplines within the domain of Islamic sciences; short research notes or communications, containing original ideas or discussions on vital issues of contemporary concern and book reviews; and brief reader comments, or statements of divergent viewpoints.

Three copies of a manuscript should be submitted to the Editor together with floppy diskettes in Microsoft Word. The manuscripts should be printed in double space on one side of the sheet. The cover page should carry the title, name of the author(s), affiliation(s), and the complete mailing address of the principal author. The title of the manuscript should be repeated on the top of the first page of the text without author's name.

Authors will normally receive a decision on their papers within three months of receipt. Papers can be provisionally accepted, and authors will be expected to revise the manuscripts on the recommendation of referees. The editorial board reserves the right to edit a manuscript to make it more readable.

The manuscript should follow the *Chicago Manual of Style*, latest edition. The title should be as concise as possible and should appear on a separate sheet together with the name(s) of the author(s) and the full postal address of their institution(s). A short running title of not more than 40 characters (including spaces) should also be included. Headings and sub-headings for different sections of the paper should be indicated clearly. A brief informative abstract of 150 words or less should be provided with the article. It should state the purpose, methods and results of the study. References should be sequentially numbered in the text in superscripts. References and notes should be combined in one sequence and should be typed at the end of the text in order of appearance with corresponding Arabic numerals. Some specimen citations are given below:
