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# FOREWORD

Welcome to the biannual issue of Journal of Islam in Asia. First and foremost, we would like to thank Allah SWT for blessing us with the opportunity to publish this second issue of the year 2023. Hopefully, this publication will be of benefit to readers and to the *ummah*. In addition, we would like to thank everyone who has contributed to the process of completion and publication of this issue. May your efforts be rewarded by Allah SWT.

The Journal of Islam in Asia (JIA) is a peer-reviewed international Arabic-English online journal, published biannually in June and December by the International Islamic University Malaysia. The Journal includes articles, selected studies, book reviews, reports of conferences etc., which are relevant to Islamic thought and Muslim concerns. The Journal sees itself as an instrument, and an extension, to promote the IIUM's mission of (IIICE); Integration, Islamicization, Internationalization, and Comprehensive Excellence.

The June issue of 2023 consists of twelve articles in which, eight of the articles are in Arabic and another four articles are in English. The first article of this issue is The Impact of Peaceful Coexistence in Protecting The Homeland in The Sunnah of The Prophet: An Analytical Study in The Light of Contemporary Reality. The authors of this article discuss the concept of Peaceful Existence in light of the Sunnah of the Prophet, highlighting several elements of Peaceful Coexistence like justice, equality, recognition of other religions, and the principle of pluralism among the sects of a homeland. The second article, The Principle of Justice in The Principles of Jurisprudence, studies the principle of justice in the field of Usul al-Figh specifically focusing on the impact of the principle towards the theoretical origins of Sharia and its reflection on Islamic thinking. The third Arabic article, The Concept of Responsibility for Citizen's Health **Insurance from the Perspective of Islamic Economics: An** 

Analytical Study, looks into citizens' health insurance from the perspective of Islamic economics by analysing the practices in citizen's health insurance like the practice of national funding, state treasury, or the management of *zakat* and *waqf*. Besides that, the fourth Arabic article is **Adoption** among Muslims in Bangkok: A Jurisprudential Study of **Causes, Effects, and Prevention**. In this article, the authors look into the practice of adoption specifically the adoption of Muslims in Bangkok by analysing literature and interviewing the authorities involved in the process of adoption in a field study conducted by the researchers. The next Arabic article is Qualities of Good Leadership and its Role in the **Development of Management in Islamic Thought:** "Lessons Learned from the Model of 'Abd Al-Malik Ibn Marwan". This article studies a great Islamic figure, 'Abd Al-Malik Ibn Marwan. specifically looking into his administrative leadership model of Islamic as а administration. The sixth Arabic article in this issue is The Default Jurisprudence of The Almalikiat from The Almudawana Book Statement and Investigation. This discusses the subject of the article hypothetical jurisprudence of the Malikis in an attempt to clarify the subject discussed through a study of the book Al-Mudawana fi Al-Maliki Jurisprudence. The next Arabic article is Islamic Jurisprudential Adaptation of The Crime of Electronic Extortion and The Jurisprudential Rooting of The Penalties Contained in The Gulf Regulations. The authors provide a juristic study of the crime of electronic extortion by reviewing and examining the laws and regulations of the Gulf region while also highlighting the need for a jurisprudential approach based on Islamic principles. The last Arabic article in this issue is The Localization of Social Sciences in The Islamic Context: Concept and Scale. This study attempts to examine the subject of localization in the field of social sciences by developing an initial scale consisting of seven levels to determine the extent of achieving localization in social sciences.

The first English article in this issue is **The Role of CSOs in The Democratisation Process in Iraqi Kurdistan**. The authors attempt to demonstrate the importance of the role of CSOs in the democratization process in Iraqi Kurdistan through historical, descriptive, and political analysis. Next, the second English article is **Integrating Gold-Backed Cryptocurrency for Blockchain Net Settlement to Achieve Future Economic Stability**. This study looks into the possibility of implementing Gold-backed cryptocurrency for net settlement through blockchain technology along with an Islamic fiscal policy in solving economic problems such as inflation and change of value of money, thus leading to economic stability in the future. The third English article is Sejahtera leadership: An Indigenous Malay Concept in Higher Education for Sustainable Development. The authors propose a leadership style called *sejahtera* leadership in fulfilling the call for sustainability in the higher education sector that is in line with the education for sustainable development (ESD) agenda of the sustainable development goals (SDGs) on quality education by focusing on inner self and the outer elements of social, economic, and environmental development. The last English article in this issue is Millennial Muslims and Use of Cyber-Islam: A Case Study of Bilal Philips and Mufti Menk on Twitter and their Impacts. This study investigates the views of Millennial Muslims on the intersection of Islam and online platforms through the use of Twitter by scholars and preachers as well as discovering how the intersection impacts the way Islamic knowledge is communicated through social media.
