

08 RESTORING HISTORICAL CITY OF MEDAN BANDAR ALOR SETAR

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ABSTRACT

The proposed landscape architecture project aims to restore the historic and cultural heritage of Medan Bandar Alor Setar and its surroundings. Since 1735, Alor Setar has become the centre of administration, under the Sultan Muhammad Jiwa Zainal Abidin Mu'adzam Shah II (1710-1778). He was the nineteenth Ruler of the state of Kedah. Uniquely, Alor Setar is one of the oldest Malay Royal Towns located on the northern part of the Peninsula loaded with authentic heritage treasures. Due to rapid urbanisations, uncontrolled developments can affect the heritage assets of the site. The spills of development within the city centre have potential to change the site's historic and cultural identity. Therefore, the project proposes a restorative solution using landscape solutions to protect the identity of the place and its society with a concept of 'Intertwine of Remembrance'.

INTRODUCTION

The project aims to provide a restorative landscape design using outdoor linkages within the Medan Bandar Alor Setar. The issues are due to rapid developments that have the potential to implicate the heritage assets of the site and its precinct. Secondly, lack of heritage management and maintenance also contributes to that. The circumstances can influence the sustainability of the historic and cultural identity of the Royal Malay Town.

It is anticipated that the landscape design can upgrade the site's accessibility, heritage authenticity and identity. Thus, the proposed landscape design intends to balance between the new and old developments. The objectives of the project are as follows:

- 1. To conserve the historical and cultural values of the site for future generations;
- 2. To improve pedestrian accesibility to Medan Bandar Alor Setar
- 3. To restore the heritage identity of Medan Bandar, Alor Setar

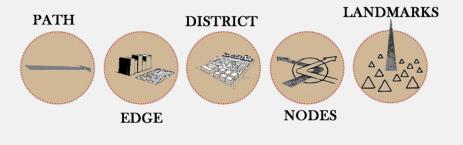


Figure 4: Town scape elements in urban design

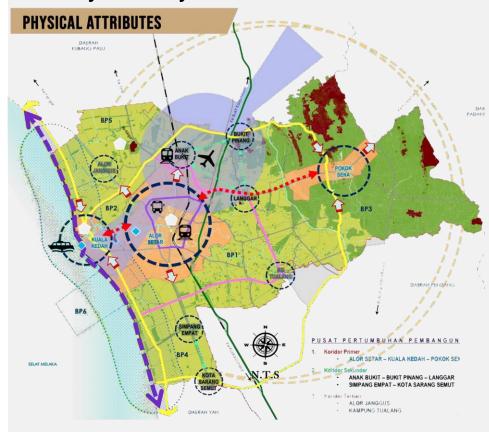


Figure 5: Site accessibility

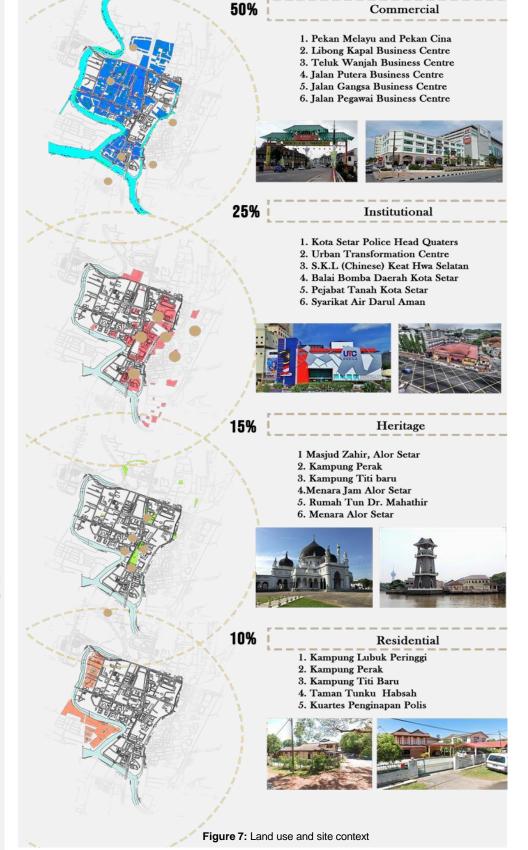
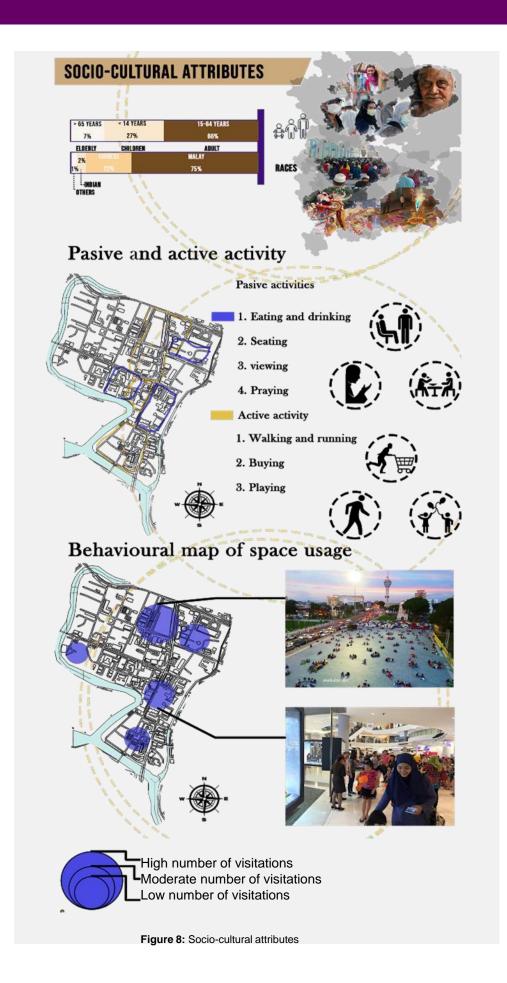
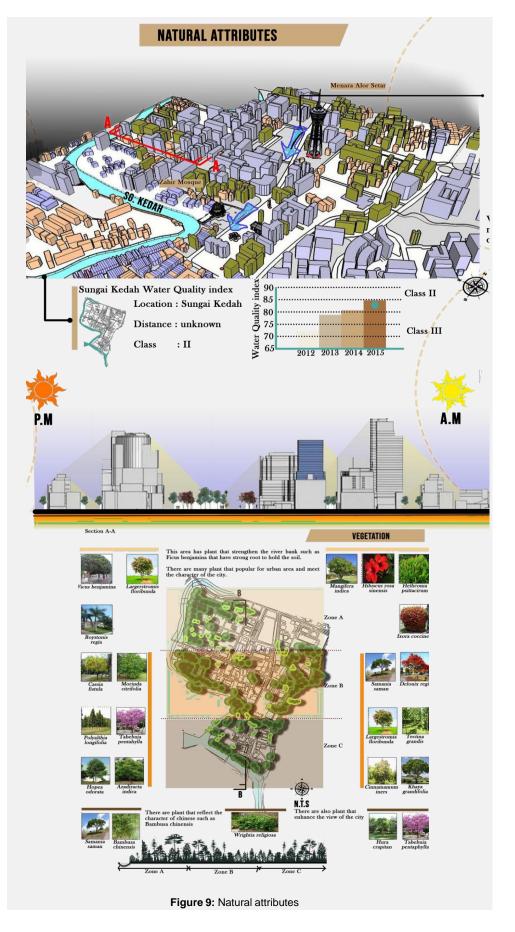


Figure 6: Solid and void

Findings

Propose to link the outdoor spaces to the historical sites along Jalan Darul Aman using pedestrian walkway and bicycle lane. Some facades of old commercial buildings are in bad condition, due to flash floods effect. The area requires a sustainable landscape solutions to restore the existing heritage.

1. Walkable city

Connect all spaces and historical sites along Jalan Darul Aman by providing a connected pedestrian walkway and bicycle lane.

2. Riverfront recreation

The water body can enhance the natural heritage of the city; e.g. upgrading the river condition using riparian plant species can improve the water and visual qualities. One of the attractions of Sg. Kedah is the waterfront area of Tanjung Chali that has potential for a water theme park.

3. Restoration through treat prevention

Using porous paving materials can reduce the water runoff. Parking at the Dataran Masjid Zahir and other flood prone areas can be improved using similar materials. The approach can reduce issue of flash flood.

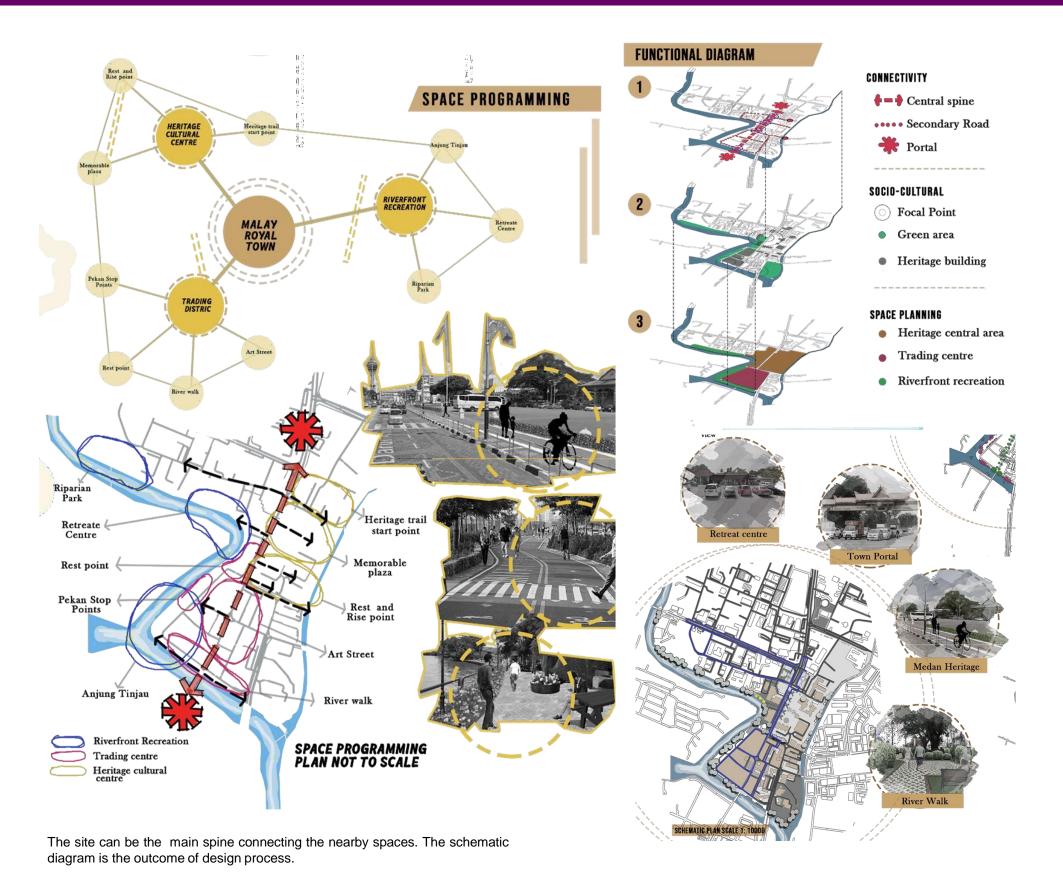
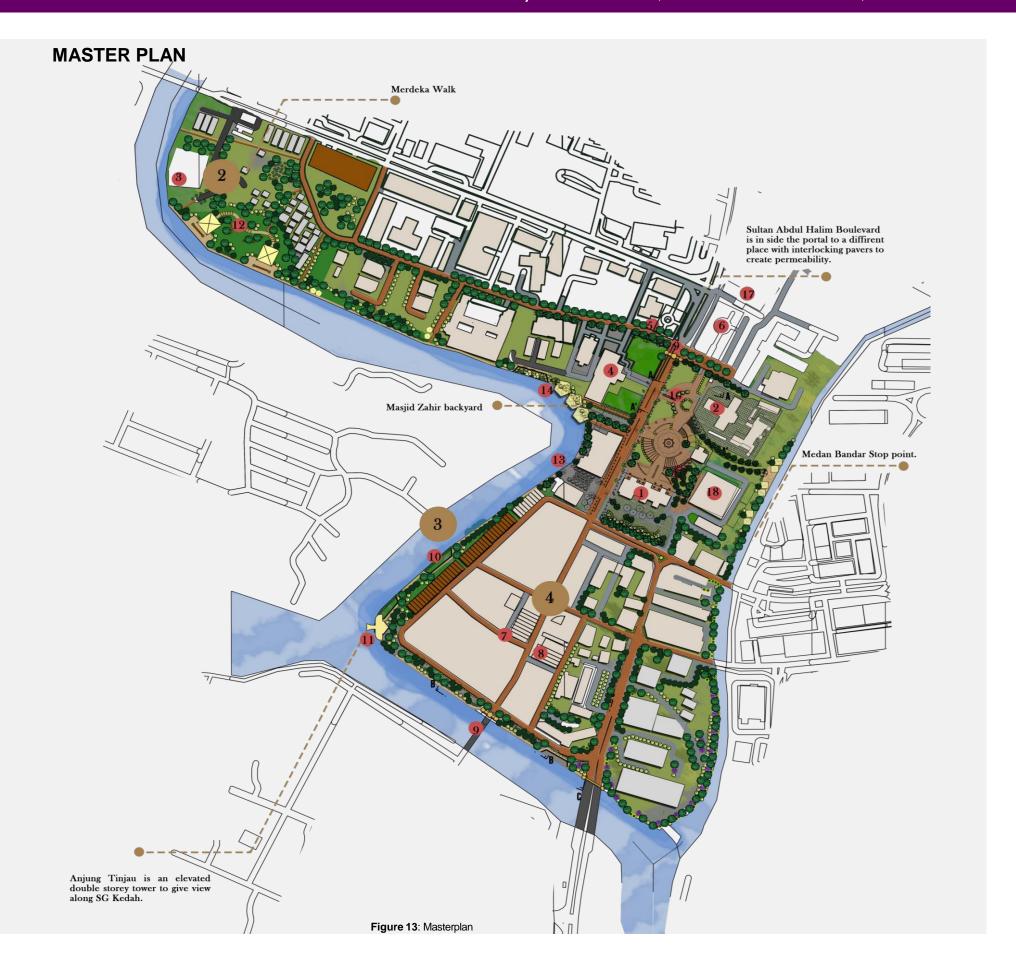


Figure 11: Main spaces provide connectivity within the area.

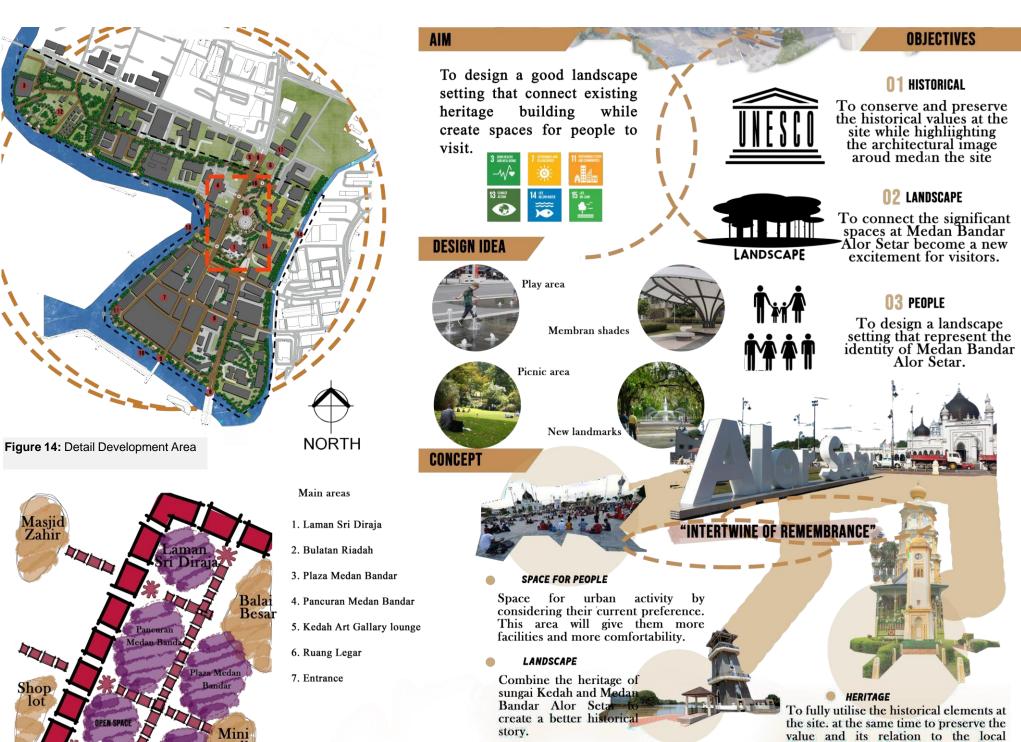
Figure 12: Schematic Plan

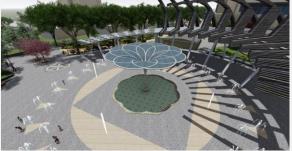

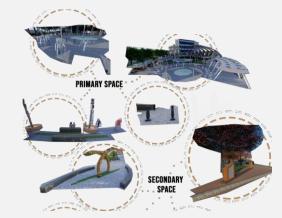

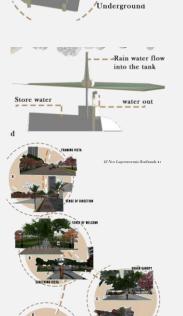
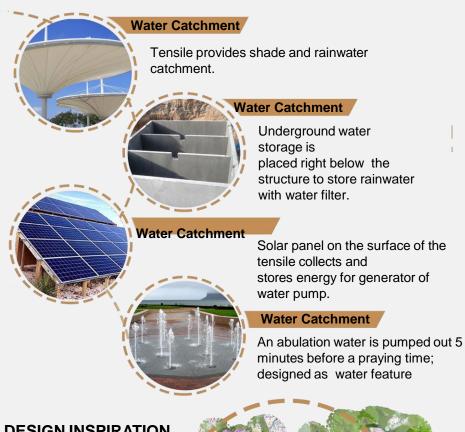


Figure 18: Hardscape and softscape elements

Common name - Bungor Kedah.

Store rainwater, solar energy and water pump would start operation 5 minutes before a praying times. The mechanism reminds the Muslims who pass by about the praying times.

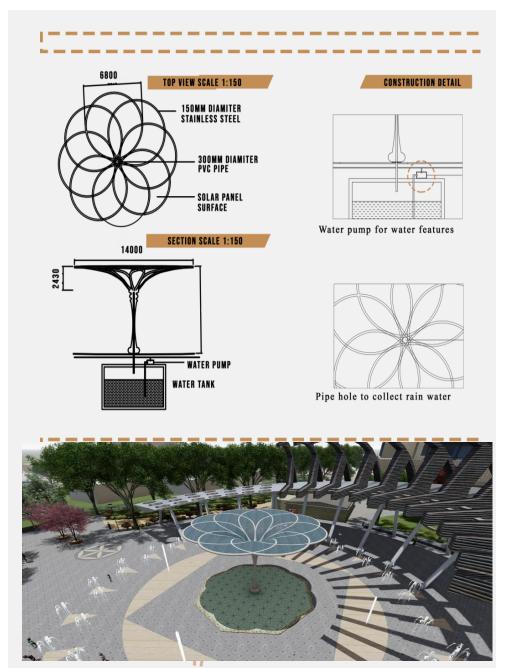


Figure 19: Proposed innovative design elements

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
